Next time you go to your doctor, take this card and ask for the hepatitis B and/or the hepatitis C blood test.



Treatments for hepatitis B

If your test for **hepatitis B** comes back negative then you can talk to your GP about vaccination.

If your test for **hepatitis B** comes back positive, you can talk to your GP about treatment options.



























Why should I know if I have hepatitis B or hepatitis C?

Hepatitis B and hepatitis C are serious liver infections and may lead to premature death from liver cancer or liver failure.

Many people don't know they have these viruses and it may not be until they become very sick that they find out.

How does someone get hepatitis B or hepatitis C?

- Hepatitis B Sharing injecting equipment.
- Unprotected sex.
- Through infected blood.

From mother-to-child during birth.

- Hepatitis C
- Through sharing injecting equipment.
- Tattooing, body piercing. From mother-to-child during birth.

Find out if you have hepatitis B or hepatitis C

A simple blood test will be able to find out if you have hepatitis B or hepatitis C.

Take this card to your GP and specifically ask for a test for either hepatitis B and/ or hepatitis C.
